





HOW TO SAVE EMAIL & PASSWORD LOGIN USING CHROME

To easily enter ScriptSure, and for prescribers using ID.ME 2FA validation, you can store your email and password via the Google Chrome Browser Password setting. This will allow Google to auto suggest your email and password when logging in. When you have your email and password setup and stored using Chrome, the Chrome browser will auto-populate your email and password info; see example here:

1. On your computer, open Chrome .
